friendship with everybody shone through!


















- Eco-friendliness –'green' if possible


The Secondary students were set the challenge of designing safety covering for the holes in the new playground wall. They went through a typical design process:

- Evaluate design and modify


Each group presented their designs to a four-person panel who then deliberated and chose the most appropriate design.


Each group then made the final design drawings and these have now been given to the project manager who will carry out the construction.
