He argued that we don't get the best out of people because we've been educated to become good workers, rather than creative thinkers. Students with restless minds and bodies - far from being cultivated for their energy and curiosity - are ignored or even stigmatised, with terrible consequences. He concluded that

We have introduced this new school P.E. kit for a number of reasons including;

- General hygiene, so that children can change before and after P.E. sessions.
- Health and Safety, it will ensure children are wearing suitable clothing which will allow them to partake fully in the sessions.
- Requests from the children themselves for a kit which identifies them as iCAN students when playing sport with other children.

The children were involved in this new initiative through their School Council representatives. They chose the colour of the t-shirts and the design.

We were also fortunate that one of our parents agreed to manufacture the shorts for us.

Our next initiative is to have P.E. bags and swimming bags designed and made at 'SMATERIA', using the recycled mosquito net fabric, like our book bags.

The Mekong River Swim draws enthusiasts from around the world who make a pilgrimage to the Prek Leap Agricultural College just to conquer the mighty Mekong river. All in good fun but with plenty of prizes and a myriad of smiling faces, the Mekong River Swim has become increasingly popular since its humble beginnings back in 1995.

Last year the event didn't take place, for the first time in 15 years. In 2011 the Mekong River Swim will be back and will hopefully be held on Sunday 3rd April!

Our iCAN team will take over the organisation and running of the annual Mekong River Swim in 2011. As in previous years, the Swim will be at the Prek Leap Agricultural College, about 6km outside Phnom Penh, over the Japanese Bridge.

The swim is open to anyone wishing to participate. In 2009 over 160 swimmers from numerous countries and aged from 10-71, joined the event and it was enjoyed by a large contingent of enthusiastic spectators. Competitors swim 650 meters across the Mekong, and return to the starting point by boat. Spectator boats will be available for those who prefer a more leisurely crossing.

Student Profiles: Name: Tao Bun Roath Age: 17 Deaf

personal statement -

"I was born deaf. All my brothers and sisters are hearing. When I was younger I was always on my own, without friends. I went to hearing school but I was the only deaf person there and I was beaten. The teacher would write words on the board but I just didn't understand anything. They even couldn't understand if I asked where the toilet was, so I left school.

I met Yim Marie at the hospital. She was deaf and I saw that she was signing. In 2002 she started teaching me how to sign. In 2003 I started to learn with DDP. They taught me how to write Khmer a little bit but I'm not so good at that. Then in 2005 I met Epic Arts. We did an art and dance workshop at the church. We did a procession around Kampot for Deaf Day, that was lots of fun.

In 2006 the Epic Arts café started. I helped set it up, painting, cleaning, it was great. In 2006 I joined Epic to tour a performance piece around different provinces. I also attended lots of workshops about different arts. By this time I now had lots of deaf friends and we had a great time together. At the end of 2006 my family had to leave Kampot because they had no work here. I left and once again I was on my own. I was so bored and I would just dream about my friends at Epic Arts. In 2008 I came back again and saw they were building this new arts centre. I was so excited to see this and in 2009 Epic Arts chose me to join the VTP. I was so happy to have been chosen.

Here we don't fight, we respect each other and communicate well. I am so happy to be back with the Epic family. I am happy to be learning drawing, theatre, dance... Later when I have finished my education at Epic I would like to work in a café with my brother in Phnom Penh."

biography -

Roath joined Epic's first workshop in Kampot in 2005, and was an enormous help in setting up the café. He has performed nationally with Epic Arts, in "Young, Funky and Able" as well as other dance and theatre productions.

When Roath's family moved from Kampot it was a real loss to the Epic Arts community and we were thrilled to have the opportunity to invite him back to join the VTP course,

Roath is a beautiful teacher and excelled whilst facilitating in local schools as part of the Epic Arts Community Outreach Programme.

Recent practitioners 4Motion commented that 'his maturity and patience supported the group workshop leaders and made them feel very welcome.'

Artistic Director's comment:

Roath is completely committed to the VTP. He always pushes beyond his comfort zone and is open to trying new techniques in dance, circus and improvisation. He has a natural ability as a facilitator and his kind and gentle nature lends itself to the work with the Peace Class, Epic's project working with young people with intellectual disabilities.
