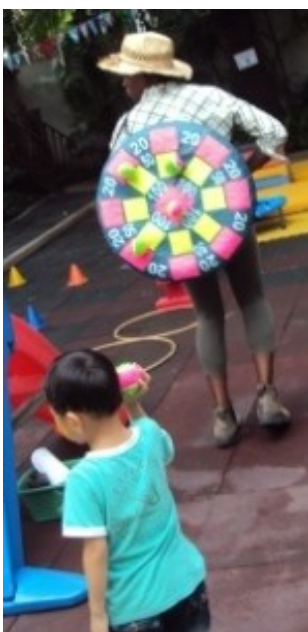
Good luck to all our iCAN families and teachers who are leaving iCAN, I know that you take a little bit of iCAN in your hearts with you.

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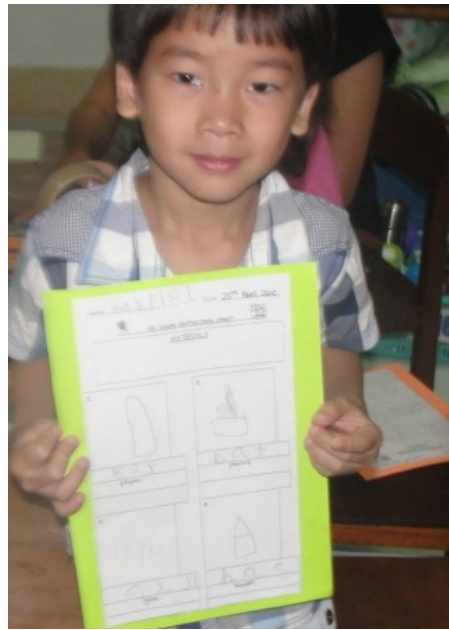
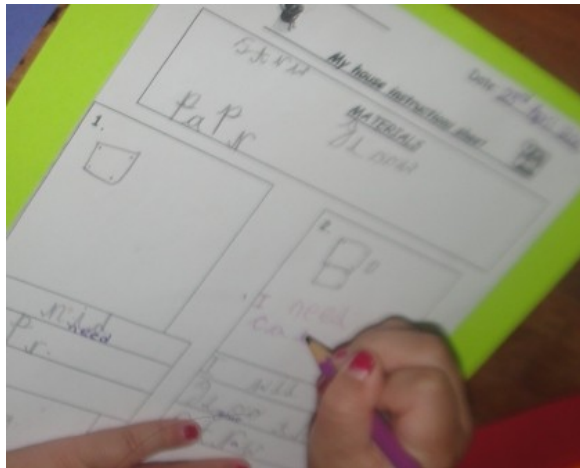
EYFS family event

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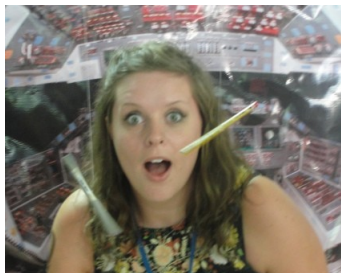
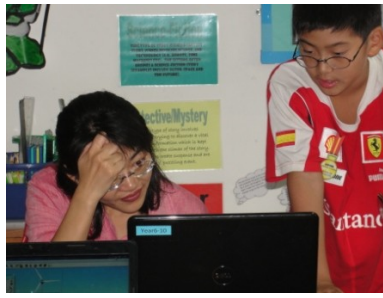

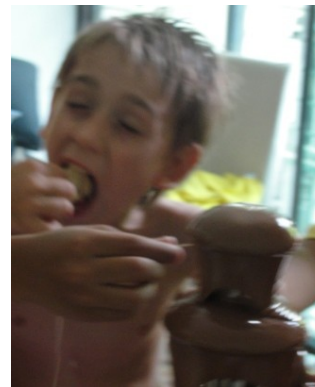

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Olympic swimmer visits iCAN!



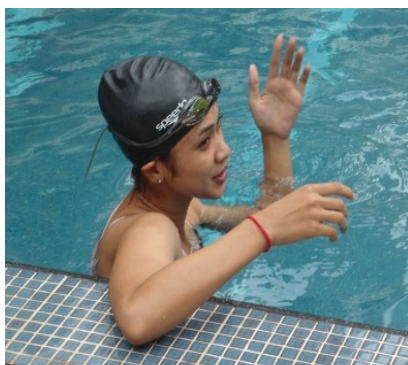

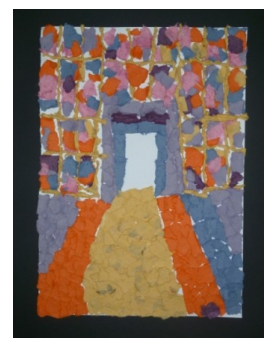
KS3 exhibition

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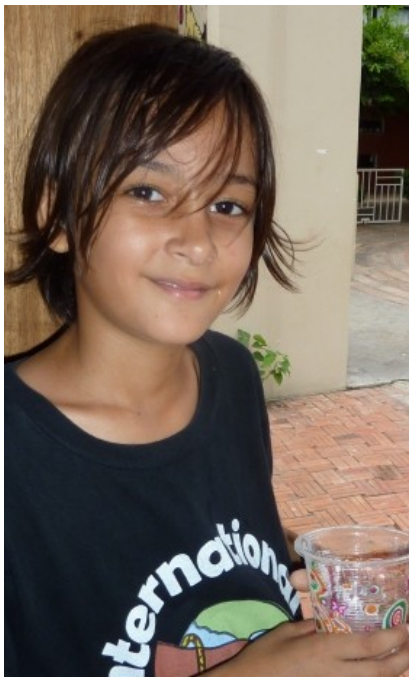
KS2 Disco

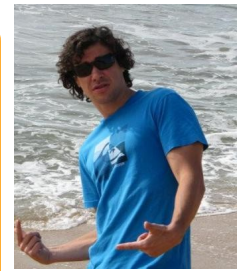
So long, farewell ...

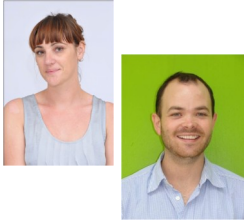

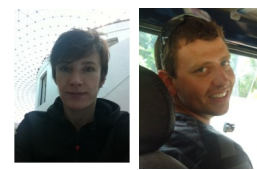
