

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MP1 Seeing the light!

Milepost 1 have had a fantastic beginning to the year and we have really loved our 'Seeing the Light' IPC unit! We had an amazing Entry Point when we had to create costumes for exploring in the dark and then we went on a treasure hunt hoping to find hidden treasure and gems. We even got to hear a ghost story in the dark which was incredible!



We have also loved being geographers in this unit and have learned lots of new geographical terms to talk about our world. We then made mini-globes out of papier-mâché to demonstrate all that we have learned. Following on from that, we have been learning about life in Tromso, Norway. It is the most northerly city in the world and during winter has 60 days of darkness when the sun doesn't rise at all. Isn't that amazing!







We are really looking forward to the rest of the unit when we will be learning about nocturnal animals, sources of light and investigating how shadows are made.

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MP2 Explorers & Adventurers







They focused on the brain, how it works and how we learn, which are really important to think about at the start of the school year. They had learnt songs and written their own class song to the tune of, 'Eye of the Tiger.' They certainly enjoyed sharing their learning and hoped that others enjoyed learning from them too.

MP3 had a blast in their 'Weather and Climate' Entry Point.

Each of the four MP3 classrooms was set up as a different climatic region. The children were in mixed groups across the milepost and experienced each of the four regions. In each one they took part in activities such as; hands in an ice bucket, making rainforest music, a season's tree and experiencing the sounds of a sandstorm whilst blindfolded.

In each region the children had to consider the adaptations that would be needed by both humans and animals to adapt to the climate as well as trying to locate where the climate might be located on a world map.


