Enjoy finding out all about their adventures in Kep, Kampot, Battambang, Siem Reap and Koh Chang in Thailand. The Y3 and Y4 children had such fun at their sleepovers which help to prepare them to become more independent and get ready for the longer residential visit from Y5 onwards.

David and I have been continuing the recruitment process we began in November and have been interviewing teachers both overseas and in Phnom Penh to join the iCAN team in August 2013. We will share news about the iCAN team for next year in LB6.

We were pleased to be able to host the launch of the International Child Protection Certificate (ICPC) this week at iCAN. This should make it easier for organisations and schools around the world to ensure that they are safeguarding the children and young people in their care by employing people who have been cleared as suitable to work with children by the police in the UK.

Following on from the success of the International Primary Curriculum (IPC) in improving children's learning at iCAN we are introducing the International Middle Years Curriculum (IMYC) to support learning in KS3. We have staff travelling to the IPC/IMYC Summer School in Singapore and are also hosting training here at iCAN in March.

I hope that you all enjoy the February break and look forward to seeing you ready for learning in March.

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## Y3 & Y4 Learning through ... sleep?












As you can see everyone had lots of fun sleeping over at school.























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#### **Book Week Illustrators visit iCAN**


