

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KS3 Poetry workshop











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Side By Side





This year iCAN has begun to support the organisation Side By Side International (SBSI), following Ms. Michaela's tragic road accident earlier this year when this amazing organisation were the team responsible for providing the initial medical care.

SBSI works with the Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) to improve emergency services throughout the Kingdom. There is no agency that they do not work with, even the army! Their motto is: 'We do the things we do, that others may live.'

Most people in Cambodia do not know that there is a free emergency service (phone number is 119 and is free of charge) that operates 24/7 in Phnom Penh and the surrounding areas and it is free of charge! Currently SBSI has teams operating in:

You can find out more about the amazing work the Side By Side team does online:

SNSI basically work 24/7 and run a very tight operation. They do need a lot of help, especially in the publicity of the emergency services and also manning the 24/7 119 Call Center. The staff can speak some English, but it would be great to have some volunteers to help in case they have some non-Cambodian emergency calls.

Peter Li, the founder of SBSI, next goal is to let the expatriate communities know that Calmette National Hospital provides first rate emergency services. If you have a serious emergency, the first thing you need to do is call 119 and then go to Calmette Emergency Room. Afterwards, medical evacuation arrangements can be made appropriately.


iCAN Teachers 2013-14


